### **Boston, Massachusetts**

The cradle of the American Revolution and one of the oldest cities in the United States, Boston remains the metropolitan center of New England. With an unrivaled history, old New England charm and cosmopolitan sophistication, Boston offers a fascinating travel experience to any visitor.

#### **FUN THINGS TO DO:**

- » Head for Boston Common and retrace the footsteps of the ducks in the book *Make Way for Ducklings* or take a ride on the legendary swan boats.
- » Walk Harvard Square's streets that date from 1631 to see its famous bookstores, eclectic shopping, art galleries, cultural theatres, and some of the best dining in all of Boston.
- » Tour Lexington and Concord, the grounds that launched the Revolutionary War. Walk the streets used by Paul Revere, see the Concord Museum, Minuteman Statue homes of Ralph Waldo Emerson, Nathaniel Hawthorne and Louisa May Alcott.

### **Portland, Maine**

Portland offers a unique combination of Maine's rich history and its own vibrant culture. Local artisans offer their handiwork along the streets of the Arts District and the Old Port Exchange. Colorful boats line the shores of Casco Bay, and wonderful freshly cooked seafood abounds in this charming seaside town.

#### **FUN THINGS TO DO:**

- » Discover Kennebunkport, a truly classic Maine village. See Victorian-style mansions built by sea captains and 19th-century merchants. Visit the center of town, Dock Square, and immerse yourself in the fashionable boutiques, shops, galleries and small restaurants.
- » Come see the Portland Head Light lighthouse illuminate over 200 years of history. George Washington ordered its construction in 1787. Today it is the most photographed lighthouse in North America, and deserves a spot in your photo album.

### **Bar Harbor, Maine** *\*Included group shore excursion: Acadia National Park*

Nestled on the east side of Mt. Desert Island and surrounded by Acadia National Park, Bar Harbor features some of the most spectacular scenery on the Eastern Seaboard. The rock-bound coast, soaring granite cliffs, majestic mountains and blue waters have attracted the Rockefellers, Astors, and Vanderbilts for over 200 years, and continue to enchant visitors today.

#### **FUN THINGS TO DO:**

- » The Asticou Inn offers elegant dining while overlooking the Northeast Harbor.
- » Take a stroll through the Asticou Gardens.
- » Main Street offers quaint shops and boutiques, where you can hunt for that one of kind Maine treasure.
- » Enjoy Somes Sound, the only fjord on the east coast.



### **Saint John, New Brunswick**

Founded in 1785, by Loyalists escaping the Revolutionary War, Saint John has emerged as a thriving port city. Its restored historic waterfront and surrounding natural beauty have made Saint John a wonderful destination.

#### **FUN THINGS TO DO:**

- » Experience the amazing Reversing Falls Rapids, Saint John's best-known attraction. Twice daily the powerful tides of the Bay of Fundy rise faster than the river can empty. When this happens, the tide attempts to push the river back upstream, then the tide ebbs and the river appears to reverse itself and flow over the rocks, creating the appearance of reversing rapids.
- » Explore Fort Howe, built in 1777 to serve as both protection for the harbor and as the city jail. The building itself is now closed, but the rocky promontory on which it sits offers an excellent panoramic view of the city and harbor.

### **Halifax, Nova Scotia**

As your ship comes into port, a bagpiper will welcome you to Halifax, the capital city of Nova Scotia. The "City of Trees" offers the warmth and charm of a small town along with all the excitement you would expect from a great city. Peggy's Cove, Citadel Hill, and the Acadian Country are just a few of the sights that will herald your arrival here.

#### **FUN THINGS TO DO:**

- » Relax on a drive through the beautiful Nova Scotian countryside to the charming, weathered village of Peggy's Cove. Walk along the rocks to view the craggy coastline with its bold glacier-formed outcroppings of granite and its impressive lighthouse. Then drive through the softer South Shore area back to Halifax, and enjoy another view of the city.
- » Take a historical and anecdote-filled tour through the streets of Halifax. Explore the hilltop fortress and the Citadel, and stroll through the beautiful Victorian-style public gardens.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

### TRAVEL DOCUMENTS

U.S. citizens on homeport cruises (cruises that begin and end at the same U.S. port) are currently able to enter or depart the country with a state issued birth certificate with a raised seal and government-issued photo ID. AAA recommends traveling with an original, signed passport valid for 6 months beyond stay, and with at least one blank visa page for visa stamp(s).

### PAYMENT

Deposit of \$250 per person/\$500 per cabin will confirm your reservation. Final payment is due to AAA by February 26, 2016.

### CANCELLATION/PENALTIES

### INSURANCE

For your protection AAA recommends travel insurance. Pre-existing medical conditions may be waived with proper coverage if travel insurance is purchased within 14 days of initial deposit only. Other conditions may apply; ask your travel agent. AAA recommends Allianz.

### CLOTHING/CLIMATE

Average temperatures in this region for May/June is in the 60's – 70's, with cooler evenings. Daytime, casual clothes and comfortable walking shoes are recommended. Evenings require casual or semiformal attire, with two formal nights.

### BAGGAGE

Two suitcases per person will be allowed by the cruise line. You may also bring a small carry-on bag.
